INTRODUCTION & GENERAL INFORMATION

The Magdalena Abakanowicz University of the Arts Poznan (UAP) is well-known for its open structure that allows students to engage in various kinds of artistic activity. Study plans of particular degree programmes consist of theoretical classes and practical classes taught in studios. Most studios are open for students from different degree programmes and years of study, which allows a constant flux of ideas, enhances creativity and opens students to different points of view.

Exchange students that come to UAP are not restricted only to courses from the faculty that offers their major. Instead, they are allowed to select art or design courses from different faculties. For example, a student majoring in Photography is allowed to select studios of sculpture, graphic design, or intermedia, as far as they meet initial requirements. Selection of courses should, however, be discussed with exchange coordinators at home institutions.

Please note that each studio has a limit of students. If you fail to register in the time specified at the beginning of the semester, you might not be able to join the desired studio once the semester progresses.

In the first two weeks of each semester, Faculty Coordinators will organise tours around studios to familiarise students with their teaching content and provide some practical information (class hours, requirements etc.).

Exchange students are expected to confirm with the UAP International Office the final list of courses within 2 weeks from the beginning of each semester.

This catalogue features studios that are likely to operate in the upcoming academic year and are scheduled to be open for international students.

The idea of expanded cinema came into being at the turn of the 50s and 60s. In recent years, it has marked its presence in relation to the phenomena that exist in visual and audiovisual arts. Today, it is most visible in experimental film and video installations. However, this is only a fragment of the potential of expanded cinema in its broad sense. One can imagine a cinema that uses many screens placed freely in a specified or unspecified space. Screens could be made of different "materials", creating movable structures of changing shapes and sizes. Many expanded cinema creators experiment with projectors. In this case, the spectrum of possibilities is determined by films without a projector, but also projections without films.

An eagerness to deep dive into theory as well as a drive for creating clean and convincing geometry is required, alongside intermediate skills in architectural design, visualisation and 3d cad software, preferably in the BIM.

The exercises are preceded by a series of lectures introducing the principles of constructing energy-saving and passive buildings. Leading trends, materials, technologies and examples of projects are discussed. The appropriate location of the building, shape of the body and structure, selection of materials and technological equipment enable a significant reduction in energy consumption and its production from renewable sources.

In our projects, we pay close attention to social problems, non-exclusion, inscribing the object into a historical and cultural context. We try to minimally interfere with the natural environment and landscape.

Based on the analytical, thorough observation of the natural world, taking into account the changes and phenomena taking place in it, the consequence of which is a specific shape, geometry, construction, we introduce students to a rich source of examples and ready-made solutions that are the reason for further design work. The result of this work is an object that meets the functional, structural, ergonomic and material assumptions.

The multiplicity of nature's responses to various physical, environmental and biochemical problems allows students to choose the most convenient issue that they will not only rationally analyze, but also engage their emotions, curiosity and sensitivity.

In the Space Interpretation Studio, we look for right proportions between individual creative thought and limitations resulting from the context and the environment. It is important to us to undertake the current problems - we live in a time of radical capitalism that deepens the climate crisis and intensifies international migration - these are factors influencing the undertaken design issues and adopted functional and material solutions. In the design process, we put emphasis on the aspects of sustainable development, climate and ecology, but also local traditions and cultural identities, combining

them with the latest knowledge in the field of low and high-tech solutions. We are trying to disrupt the existing student- professor relationship in favor of a common, egalitarian conversation in an open group where anyone can speak freely. As part of the initial design, students raise a number of theoretical issues and make the first attempts to put the studied issues into practice. The pre-design program is divided into two thematic parts, similar to the first and second semester of the first cycle studies. The first part involves an analysis of a natural phenomenon, its description and spatial interpretation. In the second part, students will learn about the basic elements of the design process on the example of solving a simple residential function.

The aim is to sensitize to the recipient's issues, the specificity of the issue raised and the spatial context in which the student proposes his exhibition. The overriding issue is the understanding of the viewer-object / exhibit-idea-space-time relationship, as well as the ability to communicate the design concept in a communicative manner, which in itself is a form of exhibition. An important value of the didactic process is the connection between the aspects of architecture as an

interior and architecture as an external form, which in particular concerns the design of exhibition stands that constitute street furniture. It is therefore a training in the perception of the relationship of contexts and their mutual meanings.

The works of our students win prizes in competitions such as Font is not a font (a list of the best diploma works of graduates of art and design universities), AQ forms, etc. The results are published in publications related to design.

We assume that students who join our studio are interested in theatre, including experimental theatre, and in finding individual ways of artistic expression. We allow them to design and carry out their own artistic concepts. We prepare students to design for different types of scenes: conventional, outdoor, non-theatrical, post-industrial spaces, and for performance activities.

Architecture of the Show Studio (previously called "Stage Design Studio II") is primarily a design studio, i.e. the priority in working with students is to thoroughly work out the idea and concept in the form of a design record, before we bring about the practical implementation of the project. The nature of design issues, taking into account the participation of recipients and viewers in the planned projects, along with accompanying scenarios (eg theater, concert, exhibition or "occasional" scenography) requires a lot of practical and design experience of the teacher. My many years of work as a designer - interior architect and set designer working on important theatrical stages as well as a teacher, helps to achieve this condition. Examples of very positive effects of the assumptions adopted in the operation of the studio are the career paths of some of its graduates (e.g. dr Elżbieta Cios or dr Ewa Mróz, who are currently assistants in clothing and costume design studios) or awards and distinctions received for female students at important national scenography competitions. The awards should be mentioned here. NeoPhotography Studio is maintained in an intermedia character. The specificity of the curriculum combines the photographic image with other forms of artistic expression (media), such as drawing, spatial forms, video, graphics, sculpture, painting and design. Introduction of the First Drawing Faculty at the Painting and Drawing department at Magdalena Abakanowicz University of the Arts Poznan


First Department of Drawing offers wide educational opportunities in the field of drawing; reliable possibilities of getting to know the contemporary and historical contexts of art through the creative expression of relations and influences of the drawing consciousness on sociological, cultural and scientific relations. Assuming that drawing is the basic form of analyzing the perception of space and its history, students at the First Faculty of Drawing have an opportunity to encounter elementary concepts related to study human anatomy, as well as the broad programme, intellectual and workshop potential of each studio taking the place at the First Drawing Faculty. This diversity of the offered programs is a strong advantage. Experiences in drawing and around-drawing activities such as cover-reveal, continuum, in-out, far-close, together-apart, symmetry or its lack provide yet another aspect of educating young people: closely related to the modern times, where decision-making

and risk-taking prepare the students to work after graduation. It is important to understand that drawing learning in terms of spontaneous perception, support creation of space for a human being with a dynamic psychological field leads to the feeling of time, and critical art practice. Along with the belief that the medium implies the material dimension of the statement, and the artistic statement as a whole is characterized by a mental dimension, the programs of the First Department allow for using multimedia expressing the message (for older students).

A wide spectrum of programs of the Faculty: from studio life, human body drawing, studying still-lives to reinterpreting reality and communicating contexts by discussing projects, collecting data, analyzing and debating – can be expressed in a variety of media.

In each of the existing Departments of our University

– the germ of the concept begins with drawing.

In this atmosphere, we try to convey the full spectrum of drawing competences as well as all the skills to use it as a contemporary medium of creation - being aware that DRAWING is a process, a process of experiencing, perfecting the idea and form of a work, experimenting, discovering errors and eliminating them over time.

The studio is open to all methods of artistic expression - including the most non-classical ones: drawing performance, installation, video art, etc., as well as those that cannot be pigeonholed into a specific discipline, also those hitherto unrecognized, which in a moment will create the most current "nerve" of contemporary art.

The optimal solution for the 14th Drawing Studio is when there is an intriguing "drawing intention" and a properly found form behind the creation of each work.

What is very important, we focus on the individual development of students and students, while emphasizing that the studio is a common space for creative work for people studying at all faculties of UAP.

The program of this studio is based on the premise that the most important objective of art didactics is to care about the growth of students' individual relationship to art and their self-reliance in the discovery process of fine art subjects. Painting is a domain of emotions, thinking and self-expression. It requires personal engagement, creativity

and imagination, but also responsibility and self-criticism. The quality of art-work depends on the authenticity of the artist's creative motivation and thus on the truthfulness of his issue with the world. The pillars of the painting craft are: drawing competencies, sensitivity to colour, ability to formulate an artistic plan and knowledge of technique. The craft of painting is also based on an openness to new visual technologies, sensitivity to the iconographical

layer of pictures, knowledge about classical and modern art, awareness of the need to redefine the notion of "picture" and that of deepening form in relation with the contemporary world. The realisation of specific semester and annual tasks is connected to other kinds of activities, namely discussions, reading, meetings, artistic and scientific

trips as well as outdoor sessions. Complementary to the program is participation in extra-curricular initiatives outside of the University and in public space projects that enrich the artistic standpoint with values of social commitment, personal non-profit and responsibility.

The aim of our studio is to teach students to create actions and activities based on the recognition of structural and social spatial conditions. It revolves around concepts of space, place, and time. In our teaching process, we take into account the importance of permanent forms and the role they play in modelling human behaviour. Humans, however, are the basic matter of every action. The body and the figure assume the function of the subject and the object. Another aim is to familiarize students with the mechanisms of creating a visual language that is characteristic for performance art. We construct a sign around the performer taking into account such notions as body, figure, silhouette, trace, memory. One of the basic concepts that we analyze in out studio is time. We perform in public space, which allows performers to become initiators of social facts.

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
