INTRODUCTION & GENERAL INFORMATION

The Magdalena Abakanowicz University of the Arts Poznan (UAP) is renowned for its open structure, which encourages students to engage in diverse artistic activities. The study plans for each degree programme include a combination of theoretical classes and practical studio-based courses. Most studios are available to students from different degree programmes and years of study, fostering a dynamic exchange of ideas, enhancing creativity, and exposing students to varied perspectives.

Exchange students at UAP are not restricted to courses offered by their home faculty. Instead, they may select art or design courses from various faculties. For example, a Photography student may choose to attend studios in sculpture, graphic design, or intermedia, provided they meet the initial requirements. However, course selection should be discussed in advance with exchange coordinators at the student's home institution.

Please note that each studio has a limited capacity. Failure to register within the specified timeframe at the start of the semester may result in an inability to join the desired studio once the semester is underway.

During the first two weeks of each semester, Faculty Coordinators will organize studio tours to familiarize students with the educational content and provide practical information, including class hours and requirements.

Exchange students are required to confirm their final list of courses with the UAP International Office within two weeks of the semester's start.

The ECTS point information included in this catalogue applies to Erasmus+ students. For students enrolled in the Study in English programme, the number of ECTS points is based on their respective study plans.



In our studio, we focus on transforming space. We hold 2 different classes, Space shaping & transforming with prof. Andrzej Syska and Knowledge of Matter with dr Magdalena Starska. You can select one or two classes.

As part of Space shaping & transforming classes students can acquire and develop skills necessary to implement issues related to creative shaping and transformation of space. The program covers issues related to definitions, ways of perceiving, mapping, designing & shaping space and all its possible transformations. Space interests us in a classical way as a "real", three-dimensional environment of occurrence of various objects and events in time (especially objects and events of an "artistic" nature). We also try to imagine and create space differently, also in a "virtual" way and examine various (not only artistic) possibilities and consequences of such actions.

During workshops of the Knowledge of Matter we will explore the topic of thinking with the body, space, group. We will try to move away from neurocentric control of our creative potential. We will develop freedom of creation through individual work with a notebook, integrate through debates and synchronous physical exercises, collect artefacts of our meetings together and leave traces of our thoughts. Together we will experiment to deepen our contact with the world, society, and our own creative work.

Intermedia Studio III introduces the possibilities of moving image art in the digital environment. Drawing from the history and aesthetics of video art, it seeks new artistic, social and emotional possibilities and contexts in which this art could develop and critically analyse its language different from the aesthetic codes of film form. The studio's program focuses on examining a very diverse contemporary artistic practice, encouraging discussion on the definition of art in the face of cultural, social and technological changes.

The studio is a place for creative experiments in the area of moving image art. We are interested in the work of art as a misunderstanding and the problem of misunderstanding between the artist and the viewer. We discuss its social and cultural causes. The task of the studio is to enable participants to learn about the specificity of the intermedia nature of this art, to enable them to take an active part in shaping the media space in their artistic and social dimensions, and to focus on a critical analysis of the phenomena occurring in this sphere. The studio offers two subjects:

- and ACTIONS IN PUBLIC SPACE mgr Karolina Kubik.

The registration for Actions in Public Space is open. All students from bachelor's studies regardless of the Faculty are invited.

Who is not with us? Is this the last question or only the first? Who has never been there and who has disappeared? Who remains invisible? What do we

dream about and what does it sound like? Can laughter be revolutionary? Where in the system is there room for feelings, change of mind and doubt? Who uses which scale and how does it smell? What time is it on the world clock?

Assuming that education is a practice of freedom and abstract actions can be revolutionary, the planned series of events aims to familiarise students with their own potential, the ranges in which one can work with public space in an original, unpretentious and creative way, and to attempt to deal with the so-called practice-based research in the context of designing experiences.

The activities undertaken at the Audiosphere Studio are focused on the issues of visual and sound arts. The Audiosphere Studio as a physical space is understood here as a platform, where inclusiveness excludes exclusivity, and its participant changes from a student to a user.

The Studio as an open place is a space for expressing one's own views and submitting them to joint discussion. We focus on broadly understood contemporary art, we analyse and critically explore the latest tendencies, trends and artistic and post-artistic practices. In this context, we are particularly interested in the medium of sound, both in relation to what is visible, invisible, but also to what is completely inaudible. Expanding the boundaries of academic activity, the issue of sound resonates almost in parallel, remaining one of the most important activities of our studio.

Examples of artistic, research or technological topics:

The topics of the studio are transgressive in nature, every year the studio implements a new main topic, which ends with an "exhibition" in the broad sense of the word (gallery exhibition, group performance, vinyl record or e.g. publication) and individual topics as an "open form" —developed together with the student.





Throughout the course, students will develop their artistic skills by experimenting with various techniques and forms of expression. Emphasizing individual creativity, the course provides a space for each participant to discover their unique artistic voice and vision. Through practical exercises, case studies, and discussions, students will enhance their creativity and critical thinking in the context of modern media and performative art.

This course is an ideal opportunity for those looking to bridge theory and practice, as well as for individuals who wish to express themselves in innovative ways through diverse forms of visual art.

The studio focuses on cinematic space in general, with a particular emphasis on image composition, narrative, sound and editing. Students have an opportunity to explore a wide range of areas in the moving image genre, including art films, engaging personal stories, narrative experiments, paradocumentaries, abstract films and hybrid single-channel forms. The courses prepare students for the creation of multi-channel installations with extended spatial order that may involve simultaneity, looping, viewer movement and other aspects. The creative process involves the use of the camera as an emphatic tool, as well as the exploration of individual and collective spaces. The assumption of the studio is interdisciplinarity and transdisciplinarity.

Students acquire a range of technical and practical skills. They learn to think critically about the topic, their chosen media and work towards developing a precise language and esthetics for personal expression. Underpinning each project is in-depth 'artist-based research'.

If an art film has a plot, it is usually a sequence of vaguely defined or ambiguous episodes. There may be unexplained gaps in the film, deliberately vague or extraneous sequences that are not connected to each other. Art films often bear the mark of the director's authorial visual style. Artistic cinema often refuses to give an 'easy answer', instead provoking the viewer to

consider 'how is the story being told? Why is it told in this way? Where is the line between fiction and reality?

An eagerness to deep dive into theory as well as a drive for creating clean and convincing geometry is required, alongside intermediate skills in architectural design, visualisation and 3d cad software, preferably in the BIM.








The studio offers the opportunity to develop knowledge in the field of sustainable design. As part of the semester tasks, students design buildings with almost zero energy demand. The exercises are preceded by a series of lectures introducing the principles of constructing energy-saving and passive buildings. Leading trends, materials, technologies and examples of projects are discussed. The appropriate location of the building, shape of the body and structure, selection of materials and technological equipment enable a significant reduction in energy consumption and its production from renewable sources.

In our projects, we pay close attention to social problems, non-exclusion, inscribing the object into a historical and cultural context. We try to minimally interfere with the natural environment and landscape.



Basic knowledge of technical drawing, modelling in 3D applications is required.










The aim of the course at the 1st Bionics Studio is to equip students with practical methodological tools that will introduce, improve and facilitate the design process both at the initial stage of searching for inspiration, as well as creating a concept and thinking about the form and structure of the project. Based on the analytical, thorough observation of the natural world, taking into account the changes and phenomena taking place in it, the consequence of which is a specific shape, geometry, construction, we introduce students to a rich source of examples and ready-made solutions that are the reason for further design work. The result of this work is an object that meets the functional, structural, ergonomic and material assumptions. The multiplicity of nature's responses to various physical, environmental and biochemical problems allows students to choose the most convenient issue that they will not only rationally analyze, but also engage their emotions, curiosity and sensitivity.








The aim of education in the Studio is to develop an individual method by a student - a design and analytical procedure as a process of conscious creation identical to design and other types of design activity. Design is a complex cause and effect process based on the analysis and interpretation of the context. The designer, in opposition to the artist, is not a one-man institution making authoritarian decisions, but only a link in a complex process. In the Low-Tech Architecture Studio, we look for right proportions between individual creative thought and limitations resulting from the context and the environment. It is important to us to undertake the current problems - we live in a time of radical capitalism that deepens the climate crisis and intensifies international migration - these are factors influencing the undertaken design issues and adopted functional and material solutions. In the design process, we put emphasis on the aspects of sustainable development, climate and ecology, but also local traditions and cultural identities, combining them with the latest knowledge in the field of low and high-tech solutions. We are trying to disrupt the existing student- professor relationship in favor of a common, egalitarian conversation in an open group where anyone can speak freely. 



Architecture of the Show Studio (previously called "Stage Design Studio II") is primarily a design studio, i.e. the priority in working with students is to thoroughly work out the idea and concept in the form of a design record, before we bring about the practical implementation of the project. The nature of design issues, taking into account the participation of recipients and viewers in the planned projects, along with accompanying scenarios (e.g. theater, concert, exhibition or "occasional" scenography) requires a lot of practical and design experience of the lecturer. My yearslong work as a designer - interior architect and stage designer working on important theatrical stages as well as a lecturer, helps to achieve this condition. Examples of very positive effects of the assumptions adopted at the studio are the career paths of some of its graduates (e.g. dr Elżbieta Cios or dr Ewa Mróz, who are currently assistants in clothing and costume design studios) or awards and distinctions received by female students at important national scenography competitions. The awards to be mentioned: Jerzy Moskal awarded in competitions organized at the Center of Polish Scenography (a branch of the Silesian Museum in Katowice) for scenography projects for Anna Kaczkowska (2012), Ewelina Bunia (2016), distinction for Joanna Martyniuk (2017) and Grand Prix for Katarzyna Łęczycka (2018).

The artistic statements (projects) created as part of the studio's program should represent connections, dialogues and relations with other (existing) artworks or the artists themselves. The aim is to formulate ambiguous reflections such as: "art about art", "art about culture", "art about artistic languages and creative traditions".

In the studio students are free to choose the medium and visual solutions when creating their artistic projects (from traditionalist to definitely unconventional means).

Latent Images Studio is a place of artistic experiments in the field of imaging forms related to the materiality and uniqueness of a photographic image. We are interested in processes and phenomena accompanying the creation of photography, as well as in (re)interpretation of existing visual materials and creation of original narrations in various forms of publishing.

Through experiences with photosensitivity, historical methods of imaging – starting from experiments related to 19th century photogenic drawings by William H.F. Talbot or camera obscura phenomena – we enable students to find themselves as pioneers of photography, learning the language of photography by experiencing its various forms. Following the fascination with the materiality of photography and its tradition, a photographic book has naturally appeared within the scope of the Studio's activities. For several years now, the Studio has been implementing an editorial and publishing program in which students create artistic photographic publications such as photobooks and zines, characterized by their unique and original style.

NeoPhotography Studio is maintained in an intermedia character. The specificity of the curriculum combines the photographic image with other forms of artistic expression (media), such as drawing, spatial forms, video, graphics, sculpture, painting and design. The aim of the classes is the free use of the medium of photography as a contemporary language of artistic and design creativity, as well as creative transgression and expansion – in technical, aesthetic and artistic terms – of the traditional ways of conceiving and producing photographic images.

Currently, general issues constituting the programme of the Studio include relations between image and object, image and text, anthropology and semantics of images, archetypes and symbols in contemporary culture, memory and subconsciousness: individual and collective, poetry as an objection, other cultures as a source of inspiration, creative aspects of relations between tradition and contemporaneity, "Third Reality" (a hybrid of reality and virtuality), individuality and collectivity in the culture of fluidity, violence of images in pop culture, reinvention of the object.

The character of the Studio and the issues it deals with are based on the understanding of photography as strongly connected with reality in its broadest sense. The photographic image is treated as a "report from presence" and a record of relations with the world.






Drawing – Another Way of Thinking.

The studio may be available to Erasmus students who can demonstrate their prior experience in the field of textile and fiber art.

We perceive textile art as the integration of various artistic disciplines and as a medium for conveying ideas. The Textile Studio combines tradition with exploration and experimentation. A unique publishing object has a strong connection with the spatial form, it goes beyond the framework of a book and it is situated on the border of an art book, a sculpture, an installation. As an art object, it establishes and maintains the relationship between what is "historical" and what is current and new in artistic exploration.

The studio's program assumes action on the border between art and craft, knowledge and practice, a physical place and an autonomous space of imagination. To create an object, knowledge and a set of practical skills are needed. An object is first created as an idea and a set of possibilities for implementing it, which ultimately materialize in a certain form, which is the result of many factors such as: time, technique, creativity, knowledge, commitment and chance.

Thinking in terms of a publishing object goes beyond the typical idea of what a book is. It provokes and encourages us to search and experience what it could be and what it could not be. Jorge Luis Borges claims that: "The very possibility of a book's existence is enough for it to become an entity", for Jacques Derrida a book is only a "theoretical potentiality".

The studio's program offers students a wide spectrum of exploration of painting as a language of visual expression. The program of this Studio is based on the premise that the most important objective of art didactics is to care about the growth of students' individual relationship to art and their self-reliance in the discovery process of fine art subjects. 








In the first year, the student becomes acquainted with the fundamental language of sculpture. Are there sports classes available?

Yes, Physical Education classes are available to Erasmus+ students. Although these classes do not earn ECTS credits, they provide an excellent opportunity to stay active and in shape during your mobility period.

Am I automatically enrolled in the courses listed in my Learning Agreement when I start the semester?

No, you are not automatically enrolled in the courses listed in your Learning Agreement. All students must sign up for a studio, lecture, or subject directly.

You can do this in two ways:

- Visit the studio in person and speak with the professors.
- Send an email to the professor to request enrollment.

When contacting the professors, make sure to ask for:

- Acceptance into the course,
- Details about assessment requirements,
- Information on deadlines and any other important information.

How can I contact the professors?

To communicate with UAP professors, please use their UAP email addresses. The format for professors' email addresses is:

- name.surname@uap.edu.pl (without Polish characters) example: marta.wyszynska@uap.edu.pl

If the professor has two surnames, the format is:

name.surname-surname@uap.edu.plexample: agnieszka.meller-kawa@uap.edu.pl

If you experience difficulties in contacting a professor, support is available through the International Office staff and program coordinators. A list of coordinators can be found on the relevant pages of the UAP Catalog.

Can exchange students participate in events organized by the university?


